



A favorite of both locals and guests is Gouverneur Beach, where parking is plentiful and the natural tidal pools by the water are perfect for children.



While there are no direct flights to St. Barts, visitors can choose from two, easy to navigate, travel options:

Getting to St. Barts via St. Maarten is the most common route. Travelers can fly to St. Maarten where they will take either a 10-minute shuttle flight or an Island ferry. Princess Juliana International Airport, on St. Maarten has daily flights to/from: Atlanta, Charlotte, Chicago, New York, Miami, Philadelphia, Paris, San Juan, Toronto, Washington (Dulles), and many more U.S. cities. The most common flights from St. Maarten to St. Barts are via Win-Air, St. Barth Commuter, Air SXM, and a helicopter service.

The second option to land travelers at their luxury getaway is via San Juan, Puerto Rico. Travelers can fly to San Juan, and then take a one-hour flight directly to St. Barts. San Juan has daily flights to from: New York, Chicago, Atlanta, Boston, Miami, Philadelphia, Charlotte, Houston, Dallas, Toronto, Baltimore, Hartford, Orlando, Tampa, Jacksonville, Fort Lauderdale, West Palm Beach, Washington DC.
