

CDC International Travel COVID-19 Requirements January 13, 2021

NOTICE: Effective **January 26, 2021**, all air passengers arriving in the U.S. from a foreign country are required to get tested within **72 hours** of their flight departure. Travelers are required to provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test result or documentation of having recovered from COVID-19 to the airline before boarding the flight.

This order was issued by the CDC on January 12, 2021. It applies to all air passengers traveling into the U.S., including U.S. citizens and legal permanent residents.

Travelers must be tested no more than three days before the departure of their inbound US flight.

TEST REQUIREMENTS:

- Travelers must be tested with a viral test (NAAT or antigen test) to determine if they are currently infected with COVID-19.
- Travelers must receive negative results and present documentation to board their flight.
- All air passengers, regardless of vaccination status, are required to provide a negative COVID-19 test result or documentation of recovery.

DOCUMENTATION OF RECOVERY:

• If a traveler has had a positive viral test in the past three months and has met the criteria to end isolation, they may travel with documentation of the positive viral test results and a letter from a healthcare provider or public health official that states they have been cleared for travel.

VERIFIABLE TEST RESULT:

- Test results must be in the form of written documentation (paper or electronic copy) of a laboratory test result.
- Testing must be performed using a viral test (NAAT or antigen).
- Test result must include personal identification information, specimen collection date and the type of test.

UPON ARRIVAL TO U.S.:

- CDC recommends travelers get tested three-five days after travel and stay home or selfquarantine for seven days after travel.
- If a traveler tests negative upon return, guidance recommends staying home for seven days.
- If a traveler does not get tested, guidance recommends staying home for 10 days.
